Career Development

- Every ACE-IT in College student will engage in campus paid employment.
- Every ACE-IT in College student will participate in an internship in the final semester of the program.
- All ACE-IT in College students will develop skills required for interviewing and/or future employment after completing the required public speaking course and complete semester career development tasks.
- All ACE-IT in College students will take part in career development activities.

Academic

- ACE-IT in College students will receive a rating of Satisfactory Progress or above in each course to be able to progress through the program.
- All ACE-IT in College students will earn 20-24 credits.
- Every ACE-IT in College student will complete an approved academic plan of study based on program requirements.
- Every ACE-IT in College student will attend assessment and evaluation meetings.

Independent Living

- Each ACE-IT in College student will lead their semester team meetings.
- Each ACE-IT in College student will be able to identify resources and services on VCU campuses after taking UNIV 101.
